Feast days of the week in March

Monday 21st St. Enda. Enda was a warrior king of Oriel in Ulster, converted by his sister Saint Fanchea, a nun. About 484 he established the first Irish monastery at Killeaney on Aran Mór. St. Enda is described as the "patriarch of Irish monasticism". Most of the great Irish saints had some connection with Aran.

Wednesday 23rd St. Turibius of Mongrovejo, 1538-1606, was a layman when he was appointed archbishop of Lima, Peru by King Philip II. He combated all the abuses of the conquerors in Peru and built up the Church there.

Thursday 24th St. Macartan Belongs to a very early generation of saints in Ireland and is recognized as the first Bishop of Clogher. He is known as Patrick's 'Strong Man' for his dedication and faithfulness.

Friday 25th The Annunciation of the Lord, celebrates Angel Gabriel's appearance to the Virgin Mary and his announcement that she had been chosen to be the mother of the savior of the world.

Kinit 8 rows garter stitch.

Row 9 add 2 sts at each end of rows.

Row 10 knit.

Row 11 as 9

Row 12 knot.

Row 13 as 9 (42 sts)

Knit 3 more rows.

Cast off 11 sts at beginning of next 2 rows (20 sts)

Knit 11 rows.

Leave long string to draw through stitches. Fold in half and sew up. Fill head with cotton, eyes and beak.
