Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> St. Bede, 673-735, monk of Jarrow, historian and

biblical commentator. Patron of scholars.

died in exile at Salerno.

St. Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi, 1566-1607, a Carmelite in Florence, offered her

the Oratory to foster good preaching and to promote

holiness of priestly life.

Friday 27<sup>th</sup> St. Augustine of Canterbury was a monk in Rome when

sent by Pope Gregory the Great to preach to the English.

He set up at Canterbury and had much success in

converting the south of England.

### Synod


It's not every day that the Holy Father asks every
