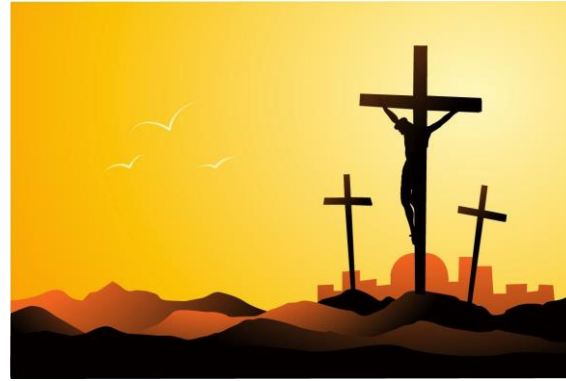

### Feast days of the week

**Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> St. Cecilia**, the patroness of music and musicians, was a second or third-century Roman Christian martyr. According to Tradition, she refused to worship the Roman gods and was beheaded.

**Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> St. Columban** (also known as Columbanus) was born around 543. He became a monk of Bangor and later principal teacher there. In 591, desiring to 'go on pilgrimage for Christ', he set out with twelve companions and came to Burgundy. He established monasteries at Annegray, Luxeuil and Fontaine. Later he founded Bregenz in Austria and his greatest foundation at Bobbio, near Genoa, where he died in 615. St. Columban is remembered as one of the greatest of the Irish missionary monks.

**Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> St. Andrew Dung-Lac and Companions**. In the seventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth centuries in Vietnam, many Christians suffered martyrdom. On 19<sup>th</sup> June 1988, Pope John Paul II canonized 117 of these – ninety-six native Vietnamese men and women, eleven Dominican missionaries from Spain and ten from French missionaries.

**Friday 25<sup>th</sup> St. Catherine** was martyred in 310 at Alexandria. Her body is venerated at the monastery on Mount Sinai.

**St. Clement I**, third successor of St. Peter and Bishop of Rome. His letter to the Corinthians called for peace and harmony in the life of that community. Exiled, he was martyred by drowning in Crimea. Later, his relics were brought to the church of San Clemente in Rome.

**St. Colman**, he was born in Munster, son of Lenin. He became a poet and later, royal bard at Cashel. He was baptised by St. Brendan when he was fifty years old with the name Colman. He was ordained and was reputed to be St. Columba's teacher. He became the first bishop of Cloyne, of which he is patron, in eastern Cork.
