

Feast days of the week

Monday 7th St. Willibrord was born in Northumbria in 658. He entered the Benedictine order and was sent to study, including spending twelve years, at the monastery of Rath Melsigi, near Milford, Co. Carlow before going, with eleven companions, to evangelise Frisia. He established a mission at Utrecht and in 695 was ordained Archbishop of Utrecht by Pope Sergius I. He founded a monastery in Luxembourg, where he died in 739.

Wednesday 9th Church of St. John on the Lateran in Rome is 'Mother and Head of all the churches of the city and the World.' It is the cathedral church of the Bishop of Rome and was called 'St. John' after the two monasteries once attached, dedicated to St. John and Divine and St. John the Baptist. It is however dedicated to the Most Holy Saviour.

Thursday 10th St. Leo the Great, also known as Pope Saint Leo I, was born into a Roman aristocratic family. His response to the call of the Lord transformed him into one of the greatest popes of Christian history. In fact, he was the first pope to be given the title "the Great." Details pertaining to Leo's place of birth are not known, but is believed his ancestors came from Tuscany.

<u>Friday 11th St. Martin of Tours,</u> 316-97, Bishop of Tours, apostle of rural Gaul, founder of monasteries. Patron of France, soldiers, beggars and innkeepers.

<u>Saturday 12th St. Josaphat</u> Bishop of Polotz, worked for reunion of Ukrainian Catholics: but his death by those who opposed it brought about many conversions.
