Feast days of the week

Monday14th St. Laurence O'Toole was born in Castledermot, Co. Kildare in 1123. He studied in Glendalough, becoming a monk there and later its abbot in 1148. In 1162 he was chosen as the first native Archbishop of Dublin. He introduced the Canons Regular to minister in the Cathedral, upholding the rights of the Church, caring for the people. He worked for peace and reconciliation and died on a mission of mediation with King Henry II and the Irish rulers in Normandy in 1180.


<u>Tuesday 15th St. Albert the Great</u> 1206-80, the Dominican theologian, who taught in Cologne, was call the 'Universal Doctor', for the vast range of his interests. Patron of scientists.

Wednesday 16th St. Margaret, 1045-93, wife of Malcolm III, King of Scotland, helped by her example and influence the work of reform in the Church.

St. Gertrude, 1256-1302 a Benedictine nun, from the age of five she cultivated devotion to the Sacred Heart and advocated frequent Communion. St. Elizabeth of Hungary, 1207-31, queen at fourteen, widowed and exiled at twenty. A woman of prayer and service to the poor and sick.
