Feast Days of the week

Sunday 15th St. Ita was born in Co. Waterford of noble and Christian parents. Early on she set her mind on serving Christ in religious life. She founded a monastery in Killeedy, Co. Limerick, which attracted a great variety of young people. She was given the title 'foster-mother of the saints of Ireland.' She died in 570. Monday 16th St. Fursa was born in Ireland and became one of the great monastic missionaries abroad. He went first with his brothers Foilan and Ultan to live the monastic life in East Anglia. But as great numbers continued to visit him there, he left Foilan as abbot and sought refuge in France. A patron gave him a hermitage of Lagny on the Marne. He died about 650 at Mézerolles and was buried in Péonne, which became a great centre of devotion to him.

<u>Tuesday 17th St. Anthony</u>, died 356, 'Father of monasticism,' lived a life of solitude but also attracted many others to form communities of hermits.

Friday 20th St. Fabian and St. Sebastian.

<u>Saturday 21st St. Agnes</u>, is one of several virgin martyrs commemorated by name in the Canon of the Mass. She is, among other patronages, a patron saint of betrothed couples, gardeners, and young girls.
