
The Mission and Ministry special collection takes place at Masses this weekend.

Feast days of the week

Monday 15th St. Carthage (or Mochuta) hailed from a rich family in Kerry. As he loved the chanting of the psalms, the local king arranged for him to become a priest. Having spent a year at Bangor he founded his own monastery at Rahan in 595. It grew rapidly. However, opposition made him move southwards around 637. Along with hundreds of monks and their patients from the leper colony, he finally arrived at Lismore, where he made a foundation, he died in 638.

Tuesday 16th St. Brendan was a Kerryman who was born in 486. He studied at Clonard under Finnian. His name relates to many places in Kerry such as Ardfert and Mount Brandon. He visited Scotland and reached the Hebrides and areas beyond. He founded a monastery in Clonfert in 568 and died there.

<u>Thursday 18th St. John I</u> was the first Bishop of Rome to visit Constantinople. He was involved in Arian controversies and imprisoned at Ravenna, where he died.

Saturday 20th St. Bernardine, born 1380. As a young man he took charge of a hospital in Siena during a plague. Then he became a Franciscan, travelled through Italy, preaching with great success. He promoted devotion to the Holy Name and to St. Joseph. He died in 1444.
