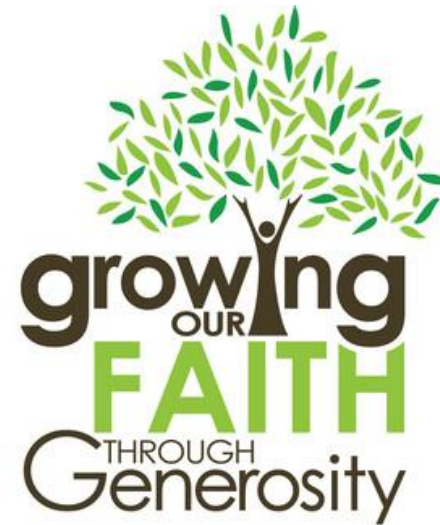

Feast Days of the Week

Monday 16th St. Margaret Mary, visionary and ascetic, revived devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and was exemplary in her patience and trust.

St. Gall was a monk of Bangor and set out with Columbanus for the Continent. When Columbanus was exiled from France, Gall accompanied him to Bregenz on Lake Constance. When Columbanus crossed into Italy, Gall remained in Switzerland. He lived in a hermitage, which later became the monastery of St. Gallen.

Tuesday 17th St. Ignatius, Bishop of Antioch. He urged Christians to unity in and through the Eucharist and around their local bishop.

Wednesday 18th St. Luke was a physician. He was with St. Paul on his second missionary journey and during his imprisonment in Rome. After Paul's death he is reputed to have worked in Greece. In art, he is represented by an ox. Patron of butchers, bookbinders, doctors, surgeons, artists, and glassworkers.

Thursday 19th St. Paul of the Cross, founded the Passionists in Rome, preaching on the passion of Christ and tending the sick, the dying and the lapsed.
