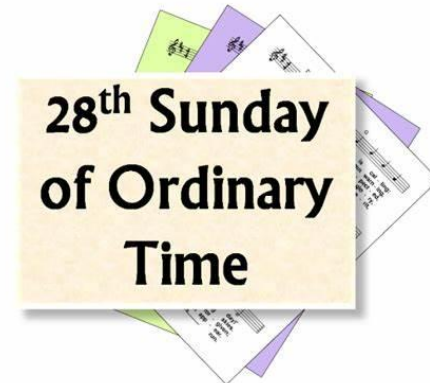

Feast Days of the Week

Monday 14th St. Callistus I, after a life of slavery and imprisonment for criminal offences, was freed and became a deacon in charge of catacombs that bear his name. He became pope in 217.

Tuesday 15th St. Teresa of Avila, deeply contemplative, highly active, and practical, established Carmelite convents under a reformed rule, and wrote much on prayer and the spiritual life. Patron of Spain.

Wednesday 16th St. Margaret Mary, 1647-90, visionary and ascetic, revived devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and was exemplary in her patience and trust.

St. Gall was a monk of Bangor and set out with Columbanus for the Continent. When Columbanus was exiled from France, Gall accompanied him to Lake Constance. When Columbanus crossed into Italy, Gall remained in Switzerland. He lived in a hermitage, which later became the monastery of St. Gallen.

Thursday 17th St. Ignatius, bishop of Antioch.

Friday 18th St. Luke, a physician. He was with St. Paul on his second missionary journey and during his imprisonment in Rome. In art an ox represents him. Patron of butchers, bookbinders, doctors, surgeons, artists, and glassworkers.
