Feast Days of the Week

Monday 7th Our Lady of the Rosary. Today's celebration urges all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ, following the example of the Blessed Virgin Mary who was in a special manner associated with the incarnation, passion, and glorious resurrection of the Son of God.

Wednesday 9th St. Denis, one of the patrons of France.
