## **Feast Days of the Week**

Monday 4<sup>th</sup> St. Charles Borromeo, Cardinal Archbishop of Milan at the age of twenty-one, worked for reform in his diocese, drafting the Catechism of the Council of Trent. Patron saint of catechists and seminarians.

<u>Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> St Martin de Porres</u>, became a Dominican lay brother, spending his nights in prayer and penance, caring for the sick and the poor. He is renowned for his devotion to the Blessed Sacrament.

<u>Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> St. Willibrord</u>, born in Northumbria. He entered the Benedictine order where he studied at Milford, Co. Carlow. He established a mission at Utrecht and was ordained Archbishop by Pope Sergius. He founded a monastery in Luxembourg, where he died.
