



## **Feast days of the week**

Monday 17<sup>th</sup> Seven Founders. In the early thirteenth century, seven young merchants of Florence decided to help one another to live more perfect Christian lives. As a result of a vision, they became known as the 'Servants of Mary' and followed the Rule of St. Augustine.

<u>St. Fintan</u> was born in Leinster. He received his religious formation in Terryglass, Co. Tipperary, under the abbot Colum, and was deeply influenced by his penitential practices and the severity of the Rule. Fintan made his own foundation in Clonenaugh, Co. Laois. He died in 603.

<u>Friday 21<sup>st</sup> St Peter Damian</u>, 1007-72, gave up teaching to become a hermit. Later he was Cardinal Bishop of Ostia. He was outstanding reformer of Church life and discipline.

<u>Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> The Chair of St. Peter</u>. This ancient feast relates to early Roman Custom at this time of year of remembering the ancestors of the family. The feast celebrates Peter as Bishop of Rome and the focus of unity in the communion of one faith.
